**United States proposes tariffs on an additional \$16 billion of Chinese imports** (effective date August 23, 2018). <u>Final List of Commodities Here.</u>

**August 23, 2019** – President Trump announced that tariffs on Chinese imports from List Two will increase from 25% to 30% on October 1, 2019

United States finalizes additional \$200 billion of Chinese goods targeted for an additional tariff of 10% (effective date Sept. 24, 2018). Effective 12:01 AM Friday May 10: List 3 tariffs increased from 10% to 25% Final List Here.

- 1. Exported from China before May 10, 2019, and entered the US before June 1: 10%
- 2. Enters the US on or after June 1, 2019: 25% -- the China export date has no relevance.
- 3. Exported from China after May 10, 2019: 25% no exceptions

August 23, 2019 – President Trump announced that tariffs on Chinese imports from List Three will increase from 25% to 30% on October 1, 2019

September 3, 2019 - Federal Register Notice increasing tariffs on lists 1-3 from 25% to 30% on October 1, 2019.

May 23, 2019 – USTR anticipates that the window for submitting exclusion requests will open on or around June 30, 2019.

May 12, 2019 China announces Retaliation: increasing previously announced tariffs on agriculture and forest products and other US exports, ranging from 5-25% on 5,200 goods valuing \$60 billion. Effective June 1, 2019. Note: be sure to consult the HTC#, not the product description, as we have found the Google Translate not always accurate.
